

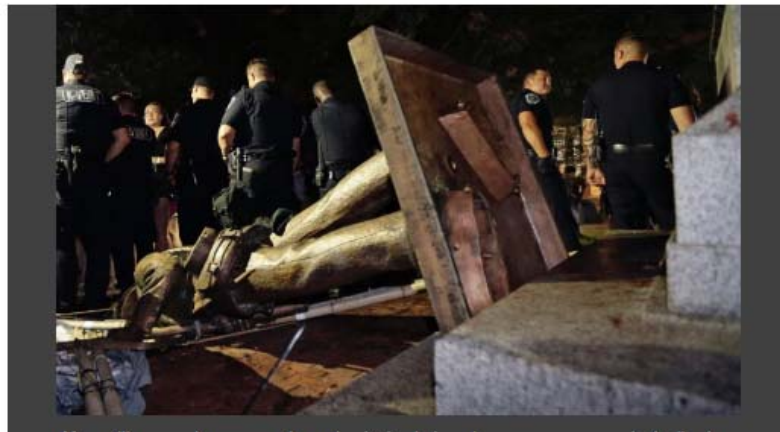


**Historical Dialogues**

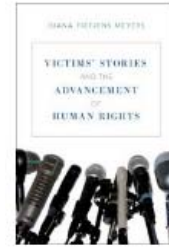
