
Jelena Jacimovic's Srebrenica-inspired exhibition, 'ArchiWar: Stories and Memories of the Srebrenica Genocide,' provides an important reconceptualization of the use of archival documents in an exhibition space. Jacimovic, an illustrator and designer, relied on archival documents housed at the International Criminal Tribunal for the Former Yugoslavia and the Humanitarian Law Centre in Belgrade to create a visual reflection on a subject rarely discussed in Serbia. Born in Serbia in 1992, Jacimovic was inspired to explore these testimonies precisely because they were not part of the public discourse.



COVID Story Project is a free platform launched as a direct response to the isolation felt by COVID-19 as well as the deep inequalities being faced by various communities across the country.
